EQUIPMENT – GOLF COURSE

- A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize purchasing two (2) Toro Workman MD on NYS Contract and GSA (Federal) Contract for a total of \$14,703.00.
- A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize purchasing one (1) Toro Pro Force Blower on NYS Contract and GSA (Federal) Contract for a total of \$6,728.00.

- A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize purchasing one (1) Montezuma Tool Cabinet on NYS Contract and GSA (Federal) Contract for a total of \$3,330.00.
- A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize purchasing one (1) John Deere Loader for a total of \$4,887.00. (Quotes were solicited for this item.)

BID – PESTICIDES & FERTILIZERS – GOLF COURSE

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize going out to bid for pesticides and fertilizers for the golf course for 2014.

<u>AMENDMENT – AGREEMENT WITH ROCKLAND MOBILE CARE</u> A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize Supervisor Finn to enter into an amendment to the Agreement with Rockland Mobile Care, Inc. to reduce the sum to be paid to Rockland Mobile Care Inc. for paramedic services in 2014 from \$336,357 to \$328,153.

KEEP ROCKLAND BEAUTIFUL

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to donate \$1,000 to the 2014 Keep Rockland Beautiful campaign. This year's event will take place on April 12, 2014 at 9:00 am at Farley School.

BUILDING PERMIT REFUND

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to authorize a refund of \$140 to Lynn Marro, 7 Fonda Dr. (SBL 20.10-3-25) for reimbursement of a building permit fee that was withdrawn.

A motion was made by Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to approve dues for the NYS Floodplain & Stormwater Managers Association in the amount of \$50.00.

REPLACING/UPGRADING COMPUTERS AT TOWN FACILITIES

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to approve \$9,350.00 to replace/upgrade computers at town facilities. Any computer that runs on the XP Operating System will no longer be supported by Microsoft after March 31st, 2014 and this will leave the systems vulnerable.

COURT HOUSE – BERRY BURNERS

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Monaghan and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to approve \$3,850 for installation of a second zone valve on the heat in the Justice Court building. Monies are to be taken from the Building and Facilities Improvement Fund.
