Open Public Hearing

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to open this public hearing at 7:28 pm.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a Public Hearing will be held by the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point on Tuesday, May 12, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. at the Stony Point Community Center, Rho Building, 5 Clubhouse Lane, Stony Point, New York regarding the Application of Cablevision Systems Long Island Corporation, 1111 Stewart Avenue, Bethpage, New York, for renewal of its cable television franchise with the Town of Stony Point.

At this public hearing, the Town Board will hear interested persons who wish to address the Board with respect to Cablevision's compliance with the requirements of the existing cable television franchise, and the community's cable related needs and interests for a new franchise agreement.

All relevant documents may be inspected at the office of the Town Clerk, (74 E. Main Street, Stony Point NY 10980) during regular business hours.

BY ORDER OF THE TOWN BOARD dated April 28, 2015 Joan Skinner - Town Clerk - May 3, 2015.

<u>Jeffrey Clark</u>, Director of Government Affairs for Cablevision addressed the Board pointing out various areas of the agreement, including:

- proposed 5% franchise fee
 - highest amount allowable under the NYS Public Service Law
 - o amount paid fluctuates as it's based on revenues collected
- this contract mirrors the Verizon agreement and will run for 15yrs
- Cablevision currently serves approximately 3,546 households
- Town would receive a \$9600 grant for audio/visual equipment, etc.

Public Input

<u>Susan Filgueras</u> – Mott Farm Rd spoke about the length of the agreement and asked if they could provide updated audio/visual equipment for Pyngyp School and the Stony Point Historical Society.

<u>George Potanovic</u> – Old Gate Hill Rd spoke about amending the contract to end the same time as the Verizon contract, to have Cablevision provide a TV studio

for the Town Board meeting room, and to provide more WiFi accessibility throughout the Town.

Discussion developed between the Town Board and Mr. Clark.

Brian Nugent, Special Counsel spoke in favor of the two agreements ending at different times. He felt that would give the Town a much better advantage for negotiating. He also indicated that there is a "level playing field" requirement in the NYS Public Service Law which dictates certain areas that cannot be changed.

<u>Action</u>

It was agreed that the Public Hearing will be continued at the May 26th meeting. In the meantime, the Board will compare the two agreements and discuss the advantages/disadvantages of having both agreements end at the same time.
