CHAIRMAN PURCELL: So we'll start with first on the agenda, DiMarsico. DiMarsico.

MR. DiMARSICO: Yeah. Anthony
DiMarsico, 41 Washburns. Just changing the use to a two-family.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Uh-huh.
MR. DiMARSICO: And if there's any questions.

MR. POTANOVIC: Is there any microphone for the speaker?

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: You know what, George? I don't know. It should be there.

MR. POTANOVIC: I mean, this is why we have this room for everyone to hear what's going on.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Yeah. I'll just give you -- you come up here, bud.

MR. DiMARSICO: Sure.
CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Sorry for the inconvenience. I'm not the tech guy.

MR. DiMARSICO: Anthony DiMarsico, 41 Washburns Lane, changing my property use to a two-family.

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CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Okay. So is
anything -- John is not here from the
Building Department. So everything's been submitted to the Building Department?

MR. DiMARSICO: Everything is in.
CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Drawings are there now?

MR. DiMARSICO: Drawings, they have everything.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Okay. So at this juncture, John, what are we waiting on?

MR. O'ROURKE: Just to explain, because obviously, there's no engineer and attorney representing this. This is an existing home. There's no expansion required with this. It's an internal wall so there's no difference, exterior, what anybody is going to see, or actually in the driveway because I believe the owner is living there already. So it's just to give them some privacy. But to make it a two-family, you have to come in front of this Board for that requirement.

So we have no engineering issues. I don't believe.

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CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Sam?
MS. JUSTINIANO: We don't have any
outstanding comments. The only thing is I don't know if we heard back as far as GML. MR. O'ROURKE: We have not.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: No, we have not. MR. O'ROURKE: So there's no action the Board can take other than if you wish, you can close the public hearing. But you really can't take any other action. Yeah. You can't really take any other action other than waiting for the County, for the 30 days to expires.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: All right, so. MS. MAHONEY: Excuse me. Where is the wall actually going to be? CHAIRMAN PURCELL: This is not a public hearing, ma'am. This is just the applicant speaks to the Board and we keep moving forward. It's not a question and answer. PUBLIC SPEAKER: It's adjacent to that property. That's why she wants to know. CHAIRMAN PURCELL: I mean, but it's not a question and answer. Just, you voice what

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your concern is and then we take it in.

MR. O'ROURKE: But you haven't opened the public hearing yet.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: I know. We didn't get there yet, so. All right, so I'm going to need a motion from the Board now to open the public hearing on DiMarsico.

MR. DiMARSICO: DiMarsico.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: DiMarsico.
MR. DiMARSICO: Yeah.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Property to a --

BOARD MEMBER ROGERS: I'll make that motion, Mr. Chairman.

BOARD MEMBER BIEHLE: I'll second it.

PUBLIC SPEAKER: My property abuts his property.

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Okay. Just speak into the -- thank you.

MS. MAHONEY: My property abuts his property. I live on Clark Road. It's the back of the property. I just want to know

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where the wall is going to be. Is it going to affect my property?

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: All right.
MR. O'ROURKE: If I may. Normally you
don't have a give and take. But no, it's an internal wall in his house. So there's going to be --

MS. MAHONEY: Oh, so --

MR. O'ROURKE: -- no change. You'll
never notice a difference from your house into his. It's basically --

MS. MAHONEY: So it's not going to be outside.

MR. O'ROURKE: No, he's not building anything outside. He's not doing an addition. He's just putting an internal wall in his house to basically separate --

MS. MAHONEY: In his house. Oh, okay. I thought it's something that was going to be --

CHAIRMAN PURCELL: No, no. Could you state your name, please.

MS. MAHONEY: Josephine Mahoney, 9 Clark Road.

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    CHAIRMAN PURCELL: Okay, thank you.
    Anybody else from the public like to comment
    on that current project? Okay. I need a --
