12	I'm in the front row.
13	CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: I'm sorry. Better?
14	Thank you.
15	BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: They definitely
16	didn't approve of the size of the building.
17	CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Right. And if I
18	remember, most of the Board I mean, I
19	don't want to speak for you. But I believe
20	most of the Board had similar comments during
21	the back and forth we've had over the last
22	couple of months.
23	BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: Even during the
24	public hearing, some of the public brought up
25	comments that we made over the last, over the

6	County finding of disapproval, a failure to

14	Board. That means not a mere four people
