RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF STONY POINT, ROCKLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "TOWN") PURSUANT TO SECTION 202-b OF THE TOWN LAW DETERMINING THAT IT IS IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST TO UNDERTAKE THE ACQUISITION OF EQUIPMENT FOR USE IN THE TOWN'S SEWER DISTRICTS NO. 2 AND NO. 3

WHEREAS, the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York (the "Town") is considering authorizing the acquisition of equipment consisting of (i) one Vactor truck, the cost of which shall be shared with the Town, and (ii) camera equipment, all for use in the Town's Sewer Districts No. 2 and No. 3 (collectively, the "Project"), at an estimated maximum cost of \$570,000, including the issuance of serial bonds and/or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds in an amount not to exceed \$200,000; and

WHEREAS, by a resolution adopted January 10, 2023 at a regular meeting of the Town Board held on such date, the Town Board directed that a public hearing be held on whether to authorize the Project, and to hear all persons interested in the subject matter thereof concerning the same on January 24, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. at the Town of Stony Point Town Hall, 74 East Main Street, Stony Point, New York 10980; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing certified by the Town Clerk was duly published and posted as required by law, to wit: a copy thereof was published in *The Journal News*, an official newspaper of the Town, on January 13, 2023 and a copy of such notice was posted on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk on January 13, 2023, and on the Town's website, pursuant to Town Law Section 193; and

WHEREAS, the Project constitutes a "Type II" action within the meaning of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA" and therefore no further action under SEQRA with respect to the Project need be taken by the Board; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held at the time and place set forth in said notice, at which all persons desiring to be heard were duly heard.

NOW THEREFORE, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF STONY POINT, ROCKLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK HEREBY RESOLVES, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Based in part upon the evidence given at the aforesaid public hearing, it is hereby found and determined that it is in the public interest to undertake the Project as hereinabove described at the estimated maximum cost of \$570,000, including the issuance of serial bonds and/or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds in an amount not to exceed \$200,000. The Town is hereby authorized to undertake the Project at such estimated maximum cost.

SECTION 2. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this resolution to be duly recorded in the office of the County Clerk, County of

Rockland, New York within ten (10) days after the adoption hereof, in accordance with Section 195 of the Town Law.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF STONY POINT, ROCKLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "TOWN"), (I) AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$200,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN TO UNDERTAKE THE ACQUISITION OF MACHINERY AND APPARATUS FOR USE IN THE TOWN'S SEWER DISTRICTS NO. 2 AND NO. 3 AND (II) AMENDING THE AMOUNT AUTHORIZED IN THE TOWN'S BOND RESOLUTION ADOPTED ON SEPTEMBER 27, 2022 IN CONNECTION WITH THE FINANCING THEREOF.

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2022, the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York (the "Town") adopted a bond resolution (i) authorizing the acquisition of machinery and apparatus for use by the Town, including (i) one Vactor truck and (ii) camera equipment (the "Project"); (ii) stating the maximum estimated cost thereof is \$570,000; (iii) appropriating said amount therefor; and (iv) authorizing the issuance of up to \$570,000 in serial bonds of the Town to finance said appropriation (the "Original Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, as the Project will also be used by the Town's Sewer Districts No. 2 and No. 3 (the "Districts"), a portion of the costs of the Project in the amount of \$200,000 will be financed as an assessable improvement by the Town for the Districts, with the remaining amount to be financed under the Original Resolution and the amount authorized under the Original Resolution shall be reduced in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the portion of the Project to be used by the Districts and pursuant to proceedings undertaken by the Town Board under Section 202-b of the Town Law, including in particular a resolution adopted on January 24, 2023 immediately prior to the consideration of this resolution, the Town Board (a) determined it was in the public interest to undertake the Project, a portion of which shall be used by the Districts, at an estimated maximum cost of \$570,000 and (b) authorized the Town to undertake the Project at such estimated maximum cost; and

WHEREAS, the Project constitutes a "Type II" action within the meaning of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA" and therefore no further action under SEORA with respect to the Project need be taken by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board now wishes (i) to authorize the issuance of the Town's serial bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation thereof in order to finance a portion of the Project for use by the Districts and (ii) amend the amount of serial bonds authorized under the Original Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF STONY POINT, ROCKLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK HEREBY RESOLVES (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of such body), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Town is hereby authorized to issue up to \$200,000 principal amount of serial bonds (including, without limitation, statutory installment bonds) pursuant to the

provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law") to finance a portion of the Project, as hereinabove described.

SECTION 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforementioned specific object or purpose is \$570,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefor and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of (i) the issuance of up to 370,000 in serial bonds authorized under the Original Resolution, (ii) \$200,000 in serial bonds of the Town authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 1 of this resolution, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds; (iii) the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the benefited properties within Districts; and (iii) the levy and collection of taxes on all taxable real property of the Town to pay the principal of such bonds or notes and the interest thereon as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness for the aforementioned specific object or purpose is fifteen (15) years, pursuant to subdivision 28. of paragraph a. of Section 11.00 of the Law.

SECTION 4. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 1 of this resolution shall be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued.

SECTION 5. The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purposes described in this resolution. The Town shall reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by Section 1 of this resolution. This resolution shall constitute a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by Section 1 hereof with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 6. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the Town without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and bond anticipation notes to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

SECTION 7. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said obligations and of Section 21.00, Section 50.00, Section 54.90, Sections 56.00 through 60.00 and Sections 62.10 and 63.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of

the Town Board relative to authorizing serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and prescribing terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of bonds herein authorized, including without limitation the determination of whether to issue bonds having substantially level or declining debt service and all matters relating thereto, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor of the Town, the chief fiscal officer of the Town (the "Supervisor"). Further, pursuant to subdivision b. of Section 11.00 of the Law, in the event that bonds to be issued for the object or purpose authorized by this resolution are combined for sale, pursuant to subdivision c. of Section 57.00 of the Law, with bonds to be issued for one or more objects or purposes authorized by other resolutions of this Town Board, then the power of the Town Board to determine the "weighted average period of probable usefulness" (within the meaning of subdivision a. of Section 11.00 of the Law) for such combined objects or purposes is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, as the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

SECTION 8. The Supervisor of the Town is hereby further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipating thereof, if applicable, as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

SECTION 9. The Supervisor is further authorized to enter into continuing disclosure undertakings with or for the benefit of the initial purchaser of the bonds or notes in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

SECTION 10. The intent of this resolution is to give the Supervisor sufficient authority to execute those applications, agreements and instruments, or to do any similar acts necessary to effect the issuance of the aforesaid serial bonds or bond anticipation notes without resorting to further action of this Town Board.

SECTION 11. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money; or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

SECTION 12. The amount of serial bonds, or bond anticipation in anticipation thereof, authorized in the Original Resolution shall be reduced by the \$200,000 authorized herein and shall not to exceed \$370,000.

SECTION 13. This resolution shall take effect immediately and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of this resolution, or a summary thereof, to be published in full, together with a notice attached in substantially the form as prescribed in Section 81.00 of the Law, in the official newspaper(s) of the Town for such purpose.




