**Proclamation**  
**HONORING**  
**BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Carter Godwin Woodson initiated Black History Week on February 12, 1926; chosen to coincide with the birthdays of Frederick Douglas and Abraham Lincoln, and was celebrated by African Americans in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, In 1976, as part of the nation’s bicentennial, Black History Week was expanded and became established as Black History Month, and is now celebrated throughout the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, The observance of Black History Month is a call to all Stony Pointers and all Americans to reflect on the cultural, scientific, political, and economic contributions of African Americans, which are woven throughout American society. We remember, learn from, and build

on these contributions, so that together, we can build a better and more prosperous future for all Americans.

***NOW, THEREFORE, I***, Jim Monaghan, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Supervisor of the Town of Stony Point, hereby proclaim the month of February 2025 as Black History Month in the Town of Stony Point.
