Supervisor Finn spoke on the following items:

• WATERFRONT – THE BREAKERS

<u>Dave Zigler</u> from Atzel Scatassa & Zigler and <u>Tim Miller</u> from Tim Miller Associates spoke as part of the team working on this new project for USA Marina. They briefly explained the preliminary concept of this waterfront revitalization project.

CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARING-PROPOSED LOCAL LAW – SIGNS

Supervisor Finn opened this continued public hearing at 7:57 pm and stated that there is essentially only one proposed change to our current sign law which is to not allow any temporary signs to be place anywhere other than on private property. The suggestion regarding LED signs has been eliminated since no one seemed to be in favor of it.

Public Input

<u>Ava Seavy</u>, Buckberg Mountain Rd. spoke in favor of allowing garage sale signs to be posted on public right-of-ways.

Susan Filgueras, Mott Farm Rd. spoke suggesting a "resident event calendar" on the town's website as an alternative to posting signs.

Sy Samuels, Nordica Circle spoke indicating that it is his understanding that all political signs must currently be removed one week after either a primary or general election.

<u>George Potanovic</u>, Old Gate Hill Rd. questioned imposing a fee for signs on private property and enforcing the current law.

Kathy Leroy, Easton St., asked if the law would apply to free standing signs advertising businesses, etc. being placed in public right-of-ways.

This public hearing will continue to remain open.

RECREATION DEPARTMENT - PERSONNEL

A motion was made by Councilwoman Konopko, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by voice vote of those board members present to approve the Playground Program Staff, with no more than 1 counselor per 8 children, a 2% pay increase for returning staff and new hires at minimum wage.

FILM COMMITTEE

Special Counsel advised the Board that it could not legally establish a Film Commission. There was discussion as to whether the Committee could use the word "commission" in correspondence for marketing purposes. Special Counsel advised that if the word "commission" was to be included in any correspondence, a written disclaimer would be required to be included, making it clear that the entity established by the Stony Point Town Board is the "Stony Point Film Committee," and, as such, the committee does not have the power to bind the Town in any manner and only acts in an advisory capacity to the Town Board.

<u>Action</u>

A motion was made by Councilwoman Konopko, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and unanimously carried by a voice vote of all board members present to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHMENT OF A FILM ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point ("Town Board") desires to promote economic development within the Town; and

WHEREAS, certain citizens in the Town have indicated their interest in attracting film making and other media production activities so as to bring revenue into the Town and otherwise provide opportunity for economic development in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to encourage all participation by citizens and desires to establish an Advisory Committee to the Town Board with regard to such activities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point as follows:

(1) All "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

(2) The Town Board hereby creates an "Film Advisory Committee" which will consist of such members appointed by the Town Board from time to time and for such terms as the Town Board determines to provide advice, information and other recommendations to the Town Board concerning Town practices and policies that will promote economic development by attracting film and other media enterprises and individuals into the Town.

(3) No Committee Member may make any commitments or be authorized to take a position on behalf of the Town.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

USE OF FACILITY – WAYNE HOSE CO. #1

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko and **unanimously carried** by voice vote of those board members present to approve the request of Wayne Hose Company No. 1, Inc. to use the Letchworth Campus for the Annual Wayne Day Carnival, July 11th thru July 14th 2012. It was further moved to close Patriot Hills Drive and reroute traffic over Knapp Road during the bazaar and to waive the public hearing for a mass gathering permit and to grant the mass gathering permit for the Wayne Day event.

SERVICE AGREEMENT – CENTURION TELEPHONE

A motion was made by Councilman White, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by voice vote of those board members present to approve the service contract with Centurion Telephone S/S Inc. for Town Hall and the Police Station from May 2012 to May 2013 in the total amount of \$1,700.00

REQUEST FOR CHILDREN AT PLAY SIGN – GETTY RD.

Supervisor Finn explained that a request for a "children at play" sign has been requested for Getty Rd.; however the Superintendent of Highways, Larry Brissing, has already installed the sign. No action needed.

SUMMER DAY CAMP TRANSPORTATION

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by voice vote of those board members present to award the bid for the 2012 Stony Point Day Camp to Haverstraw Transit in the amount of \$40,872.00.

REQUEST FOR REFUND – BUILDING DEPARTMENT

A motion was made by Councilwoman Konopko, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by voice vote of those board members present to refund the full amount of the fee of \$150.00 for a municipal search to Hanna Alonso, 1525 White Plains Road, 1B, Bronx, NY 10462

SUMMER WORK PROGRAM – HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko and **unanimously carried** by voice vote of those board members present to approve the Summit School of Nyack request for their summer work program July 9th – August 23rd 2012 in conjunction with the Superintendent of Highways, at no cost to the Town.

DISCUSSION – TOWN ENGINEER

Kevin Maher, Town Engineer addressed the board with the following topics:

- 5. Possible changes to Town Site Development Ordinance to require site plan submittal for all land disturbances in excess of 1,000 square feet to help control stormwater runoff.
- 6. Possible changes to tree ordinance and fill ordinance
