PURCHASE VEHICLE

A motion was made by Councilman White, seconded by Supervisor Finn and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to approve Purchase Order #2421 for Beyer-Warnock Fleet, 31 Williams Parkway, East Hanover, NJ for a 2013 Ford Police Interceptor Utility Vehicle in the amount of \$27,182.50 using funds from the Sale of Equipment Revenue Restricted Account.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REPORT:

Councilwoman Konopko spoke about:

 New York State has instituted a consolidated grant application whereby only one application is submitted to the state for all grants being applied for. Both Councilwoman Konopko and Karenann Nigro attended the Consolidated Funding Workshop held by the State.

- Rockland County is proposing to pass many costs on to the Towns including election costs and charge backs from Rockland Community College.
- Congratulated George Potanovic for his recent publication, "Honoring Our Heritage-Celebrating the People of Science and Innovation at Pearl River."
- Closing this meeting in honor of Marty Campbell and Charles "Chuck" DeBerry.

PRESENTATIONS:

Proposed Town Center District:

Joe Golden, owner of commercial and residential property next to Malloy's Park on Rt. 9W & East Main St. was again unable to attend for the presentation. <u>Councilwoman Konopko</u> gave a brief description of Mr. Golden's former presentation to the Steering Committee. He would like to create a "Town Center" by:

- Demolishing his two existing buildings
- Building a restaurant with retail and upstairs apartments
- Zoning would need to be changed
 - Currently zoned commercial & residential
- Members of the Steering Committee would like to create an overlay district in the Town Center District:
 - Area of Town Center District would be:
 - Intersection of Rt. 9W & Main St.
 - West to Church St.
 - East to Town Hall
 - From bridge north to several commercial buildings on Rt. 9W
 - Would like to hold Walkable Communities Workshop within the Town Center District
 - Would not affect current residential owners

 Would like to speak to Town Planner with regard to what steps need to be taken to accomplish this

Beautification Subcommittee:

- <u>Kathy Leroy</u> and <u>Lilly Ann Wilson</u> spoke presenting the Town Board with the type of bench they would like to use and locations to place the benches throughout the town.
 - Hoping to have local businesses sponsor a bench with a plaque naming the sponsor.
 - Cost per bench is \$1,212 plus shipping.

<u>CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARING – PROPOSED LOCAL LAW - SIGNS</u>

Supervisor Finn re-opened this public hearing at 8:31 pm. Special Counsel, Brian Nugent, reviewed the proposed changes as follows:

- Prohibiting posting of temporary signs on public property
- Giving parks department, code enforcement and police the power to remove temporary signs that are improperly posted on public property
- Penalty lowered to \$350.
- Definition of temporary sign was expanded to include political signs which are posted for more than thirty days.

PUBLIC INPUT

John Gazzola, Liberty Ridge spoke about the numerous signs at the parkway entrances and exits.

Kathy Leroy, Easton Street spoke about spacing signs apart more.

<u>George Potanovic</u>, Old Gate Hill Rd. questioned if a permit would still be necessary if temporary signs are only allowed on private property and stated that he didn't feel the current law was being enforced.

June Jobson, Franklin Dr. questioned who would be responsible for removing the signs.

<u>Motion</u>

At 8:43 pm a motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to close the public hearing.

<u>Motion</u>

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to refer these proposed changes to the Stony Point Planning Board and the Rockland County Department of Planning.

DAY CAMP COUNSELORS

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to hire thirty-four (34) day camp counselors with a 2% raise for returning counselors and minimum wage for new counselors. The list of counselors is on file in the Town Clerk's Office.

LIFE GUARDS, POOL OPERATORS AND CASHIERS

A motion was made by Councilman White, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to hire life guards, pool operators and cashiers as presented by the Recreation Facilities Supervisor and on file in the Town Clerk's Office, with a 2% raise for returning employees.

REFUND REQUEST – BUILDING PERMIT

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to authorize a refund a building permit fee of \$3,665.00 for 12 Hudsonview Dr. Tomkins Cove, since the permit was withdrawn prior to any work being performed.

RECREATION FACILITY ATTENDANT – GOLF COURSE PRO SHOP

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to approve a salary increase of \$2.50 per hour for Sooky Welsh, Recreation Facility Attendant at the Golf Course Pro Shop.

<u>SET PUBLIC HEARING – PROPOSED LOCAL LAW – PROPERTY</u> <u>MAINTENANCE</u>

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to set a public hearing on the proposed local law to amend Chapter 161 of the Town Code – Property Maintenance by adding a section of law concerning abandoned or vacated properties

HEALTH INSURANCE – FIREFIGHTER & AMBULANCE VOLUNTEERS

Discussion developed regarding state legislation that had passed whereby volunteer firefighter and ambulance workers who are without health insurance coverage may be covered by the town's policy at the individual's own expense. This item will be put on the June 26, 2012 agenda.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to authorize Dave Zigler, of Atzl, Scatassa & Zigler to prepare a grant application, on behalf of the Town of Stony Point, for the New York State Department of Transportation's "Safe Routes to School" program. If the Town of Stony Point is awarded this grant, Atzl, Scatassa & Zigler will be paid a fee of \$6,375 which is less than 1% of the grant. Monies from this program would be used to improve the section of Jay Street from Ten Eyck to Hastings Lane.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 9:02 pm a motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present to adjourn into executive session to discuss a PBA litigation and speak with the group of Lerner-Heidenberg-Simon.

MEETING CLOSED

<u>Supervisor Finn</u> announced that the June 10, 2012 Stony Point Town Board meeting would adjourn in loving memory of Martin Campbell, a young man of twenty nine years who was a wonderful influence on so very many people and Charles "Chuck" DeBerry who served both in World War II and Korea and was very active in the VFW and American Legion.

<u>ADJOURN</u>

The June 12, 2012 Stony Point Town Board meeting was adjourned at 10:55 pm on a motion made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present.
