Proposed Zone Text Amendment – Lead Agency Status

<u>Stuart Turner</u> from the Turner Miller Group, our Town Planner, reviewed the August 7, 2012 memo from his firm with regard to the proposed zoning text amendment and the submissions made by Tim Miller Associates, Inc. on behalf of USA Marina LLC.

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn and seconded by Councilman White to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE OF INTENT OF THE TOWN BOARD TO ACT AS LEAD AGENCY UNDER SEQR IN CONNECTION WITH AN APPLICATION FOR A ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point ("Town Board") has received the application (the "Application") of the USA Marina, LLC (the

"Applicant") for a Zoning Text Amendment for lands in the PW zoning district in the Town of Stony Point; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant owns \pm 38.1 acres located generally along the Hudson River Waterfront on Hudson Drive, north of Tompkins Avenue in the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York; and under the proposed action would be permitted to make application to permit construction of a mixed use development project including the following components on his property:

- up to 300 multifamily residential units consisting of one, two and three bedroom units;
- residential club house, 7,000 square feet;
- pool and courtyard areas for on-site residents;
- recreational walking trail to the Stony Point light house for the general public;
- waterfront esplanade areas for the general public;
- marina, 250 boat slips;
- yacht club, 4,000 square feet;
- boatel, (vertical dry dock boat storage) 27,000 square feet;
- commercial kiosks, 6 retail kiosks of 400 square foot each to support marina uses, 2,400 square foot total;
- two quality restaurants, 5,500 total square feet;
- parking 624 spaces; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has identified authorization of a Special Use Permit by the Town Board and Site Plan approval by the Planning Board as potential future related actions also subject to SEQR; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to assume Lead Agency status ("Lead Agency") and conduct a coordinated review with respect to the review of the proposed zone amendment and potential future uses pursuant to securing applicable approvals, in accordance with Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York, and the regulations promulgated there under at 6 NYCRR 617.6; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

- 1. The proposed action will require review pursuant to SEQRA, and the governing regulations promulgated thereunder;
- 2. The proposed action is a Type 1 Action under SEQRA;
- 3. The Town Board will assume the Lead Agency role in connection with the SEQRA review of this application if no other agency submits a written objection to the Town Board within thirty (30) days of the date of this notification;
- 4. The Town Board directs that a Lead Agency coordination letter be circulated among the various Involved and Interested Agencies, together with a distribution package including the proposed Zone Text Amendment, the EAF, a Concept Plan, and other such relevant information submitted by the Applicant.
- 5. This Resolution is subject to review by Special Counsel and Town professionals to determine if the submitted Application is complete and accurate.

This shall take effect immediately.

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to refund \$300.00 for an unprocessed Zoning Board of Appeals Application fee for 425 N. Liberty Dr., Tomkins Cove, NY,

NYS MAGISTRATES TRAINING CONFERENCE

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to approve Judge Franks' attendance at the New York State Magistrates Training Conference to be held in Syracuse, NY from September 9-12, 2012. The fee will be approximately \$837.40, with a possible reimbursement for mileage from the State.

NO PARKING SIGNS

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to approve the Superintendant of Highways to place no parking signs on the corner of Quelch Avenue and Rt. 9W.

FARMER'S MARKET

<u>Michelle Corish</u>, a Stony Point resident spoke on behalf of a committee formed to promote a farmer's market in town.

<u>Special Counsel Brian Nugent</u> addressed the board outlining legal concerns with regard to using town property for this type of event.

ACTION

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to approve the use of Town property for a Farmer's Market, subject to execution of a revocable license agreement, to be drafted by Special Counsel, between the Town and the entity that will represent that Farmer's Market.

FILM PERMIT APPLICATION & FEES

A motion was made by Councilwoman Konopko, seconded by Supervisor Finn, and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present, to authorize Special Counsel to draft a local law for review by the Town Board concerning filming in the Town, utilizing the parameters set forth in the application and related documents submitted by the Stony Point Economic Development Committee.

<u>SET PUBLIC HEARING – FILM PERMIT</u>

A motion was made by Councilwoman Konopko, seconded by Supervisor Finn, and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present, to set a public hearing for September 12, 2012 to consider a local law concerning filming in the Town.

BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE – PURCHASE OF BENCHES

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilwoman Konopko, and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to approve purchasing 6 benches for the Beautification Committee at a cost of not more than \$10,000.00 which will be reimbursed to the town through donations. The Parks Dept. will be responsible for installing the benches.

REFUND – DAY CAMP REGISTRATION

A motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to refund \$200.00 for a day camp registration for a child that was registered for the wrong camp.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 8:30 pm a motion was made by Supervisor Finn, seconded by Councilman McDonnell and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to adjourn into executive session to discuss a tax assessor matter the ambulance contract.
