BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. The Town Board hereby authorized the Town Supervisor to execute any and all documents necessary to retain counsel, satisfactory to the Supervisor, for the purpose of challenging and otherwise opposing a proposed water rate increase by Suez Water on behalf of the Town of Stony Point.

- 2. This authorization to retain such legal counsel shall be up to a maximum of \$2,500. Any further expenditures will require additional authorization of the Town Board.
- 3. This resolution shall be effective immediately.

Hire Day Camp Counselor

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan seconded by Councilman White and unanimously carried by a voice vote of those board members present (Councilman Basile being absent) to hire Thomas Wood, as a day camp counselor for the summer of 2016 at \$9.00 per hour.

Hire Recreation Facility Attendant (Park Guard)

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present (Councilman Basile being absent) to hire Richard Stephens as a Recreation Facility Attendants as requested by the Recreation Facilities Supervisor from now through September 5th; 8am to 8pm Concert nights, Thursday-Sunday and holidays at \$10.00 per hour.
