Code Enforcement

We wanted to update you on the latest efforts from our Town Board and our Building Department to keep our community safe and preserve the unique character of Stony Point.

Our Building Department has been working closely with several county and state agencies, including the **Rockland County Health Department** and **Office of Consumer Protection**, to

conduct joint inspections of several residential properties. During these inspections, we found evidence of illegally installed partition walls and illegal occupancy. Several violations were issued, including a \$20,000 fine on a landlord who was using an unlicensed electrician to complete work inside a home. We will continue to be tough on landlords who illegally convert single-family homes into multi-family residences.

To assist in enforcing our town code,

the Town Board recently hired a part-time fire inspector who is also a FDNY firefighter, and a part-time code enforcement officer who is a retired NYPD police sergeant. Both have vast experience in investigations and prosecution and their primary task is to work with the Building Department to enforce

illegal housing and violations of our town code.

We also upgraded and established comprehensive zoning regulations in 2021 to protect and preserve the character of Stony Point. This ensures that future development aligns with our vision for the town and considers the needs and concerns of our residents.

The Town Board also enacted lo-



cal laws prohibiting nuisance parties and short-term rentals to preserve the quality, safety, and tranquility of Stony Point. A \$25,000 judgment was issued to a homeowner for numerous nuisance party violations.

All of these actions are taken to protect

our residents and our first responders. We are committed to ensuring a safe and harmonious environment in Stony Point, and we appreciate your support and cooperation in achieving this goal.

The Stony Point Highway and Parks Department has been hard at work this spring, making sure our roads are safe and our parks are ready for the summer season. Here's a breakdown of what we've been up to and what you can expect in the coming months:

Open House: We're excited to invite the community to our Highway Department Open House, which will be held on Saturday, June 3rd from 11:00am – 1:00pm at 15 Rose Street. This is a great opportunity to meet our team, learn about the equipment we use, and ask questions about our operations. There will also be free hot dogs for lunch!

Summer Work Activities: We plan to improve the town's roads and sidewalks over the coming months. Now through the Fall we will be focusing on paving, pothole, and berm repair throughout the town to ensure smoother and safer driving conditions. In addition, we'll be conducting street sweeping and catch basin repairs, and cutting grass and brush on road shoulders to improve visibility. We will also be making much needed sidewalk repairs, especially on Route 9W. We know these upgrades will make a significant difference to our community, and we appreciate your patience and cooperation as we work to make these upgrades.

Pickleball Update: The tennis courts at Veterans Memorial Park have been removed and construction will begin on the new pickleball courts soon!

Splashpad: Our new splashpad at Charles Eccher Park should be up and running this summer and will provide a fun and safe water play area for children.

Parks are open early April to mid-October from 8:00 am until dusk. We encourage residents to explore and to take advantage of the beautiful outdoor spaces in our community. Please help us keep our parks clean by using the garbage bins available. If you have any questions or concerns, don't hesitate to reach out to our office. We're here to serve the community and make Stony Point a great place to live, work, and play. Here's a list of some of our parks and what you can expect:

Charles S. Eccher Park: This park features a brand new splashpad (open summer 2023), 2 pavilions with picnic tables, playground equipment, walking path and exercise equipment, 4 horseshoe pits, 4 basketball courts, small baseball field, 1 volleyball court and restrooms.

Riverfront Park: This park offers stunning views of the Hudson River and features playground equipment, a pavilion with picnic tables, fishing pier and restrooms.

Clark Park: Clark Park is perfect for boaters, it offers a boat launch (be sure to get your permit first at the Town Clerk's office), a pavilion with picnic tables, scenic river views, playground equipment and restrooms.

Veterans Memorial Park: You can bring your dog to Veterans Memorial Park which is home to the Patriot Paws Dog Park. Located on Turkey Hollow Road it also offers a pavilion with picnic tables, playground equipment, baseball fields (home of Stony Point Little League) and 4 new pickleball courts coming summer of 2023! **Heights Road Park** features a basketball court and playground equipment.

Laurel Drive Park features a basketball court, playground equipment, and a small baseball field.

Municipal Pool: Residents can also enjoy the Municipal Pool located on Bulsontown Road which is open to all town residents with registration. The pool will open in late June and remain open until Labor Day. Hours are noon to 6:45 pm weather permitting. There is also a playground, basketball court, walking and exercise trail. ■

Summer is almost here, and the Stony Point Recreation Department is excited to offer a variety of activities and programs for residents of all ages. Here's a breakdown of what we have planned for the summer season:

Get ready to swim! Opening day for the pool is June 24th. Registration is required and can be done at the RHO Building;

- Monday–Wednesday from 8:30 am–4:00 pm
- Thursday and Friday from 9:00 am 5:00 pm.
- Evening registration May 16th & 18th until 8:00 pm
- Saturday registration May 20th from 10:00 am Noon
- Once the pool is open you can register at the pool Monday through Friday from 3:00 pm until 6:30 pm.

Adult residents must provide a valid driver's license with a Stony Point address. Proof of residency must be provided for all children, which can be found on current tax forms or immunization records. Please note that records are not kept on file and will be returned to the resident.

Family: \$150 per family, up to 5 at same address. (children must be under 18.) Each additional child is \$40/each. **Individual pass:** \$50

Town resident Senior Citizens: Free (show ID at the gate) Daily guest pass: \$10 (accompanied by a member) Daily non-resident senior guest: \$5 (accompanied by member)

Zumba! We are excited to offer FREE outdoor dance fitness classes! Classes will be a variation of dance exercise including Zumba, Exotic Fusion Fitness and MixxedFit. Join us on Wednesdays beginning May 10 through July 5 from 6:00 pm– 8:00 pm at Riverfront Park.

Reserving a Pavilion: Planning a family picnic or party at one of our parks? We offer pavilion rentals at our parks on a firstcome, first-served basis. To reserve a pavilion, simply visit our office or call us to check availability and make a reservation. The fee is \$50 and proof of residency is required.

Stony Point Seniors: Our Stony Point Senior Clubs (55 and older) meet once per week on Monday or Tuesday at 12:00pm at the Rho Building. They offer monthly trips and other activities.

Construction is underway on a new Senior Center to be located in the East Wing of Patriot Hills Clubhouse! We'll keep you updated on the progress!

A Little Town History: Have you visited Stony Point Battlefield lately?

The Stony Point Battlefield State Historic Site is a local gem teeming with American history, as it was the site of a significant Revolutionary War battle in 1779. It is also the location of the first lighthouse on the Hudson River, built in 1826. Today, the State Historic Site, also National Historic Landmark, is open to visitors keen on learning more about this important battle in our nation's history, or just enjoying fabulous river views.



The Battle of Stony Point took place on the night of July 16, 1779, when General Anthony Wayne led a surprise attack against

the British garrison stationed there. Wayne and his troops successfully captured the fort and held it for a short time before destroying it and withdrawing. The Stony Point Battle-



field is now a 105-acre historic site that includes the remains of the fort, a museum, and 17 interpretive signs that provide insight into the battle and its significance.

In addition to its historical significance, the Stony Point Battlefield also offers beautiful views of the Hudson River and is a popular spot to enjoy the outdoors. The site hosts a variety of events throughout the year, including living history demonstrations, reenactments, and educational programs for school and scout groups. If you're interested in learning more, we encourage you to visit the site and explore its exhibits and programs.
