# Proceedings CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, next we'll do Gate Hill Day Camp Two. Now this is revised, right?

MR. ZIGLER: Yes.

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CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: It's a revised --

MR. ZIGLER: It's a big revision.

CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: It's a big revision.

MR. ZIGLER: When we first come in, we had about the same amount of buildings and everything that we're proposing. I would just go to two. Then we left, we went away, and we did a boundary line agreement. Moved the property along the McGee, Linda McGee, the boss of the family, we moved her property line along right there, and it kind of changed the plan. You gave it approval for to file it, but it hasn't been filed yet.

So what we had to do is we had to go back and redo the applications because right now we have two applicants, we have the McGee and Gate Hill as an applicant. They signed the forms and everything. Go to the next page. Okay.

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Basically, all the buildings and stuff that we looked at out there, there's -- that's still the same. We're going to move the buildings around, and replacement, as we had in the original. The only thing different is that you'll see that we have the Army Corps delineation on it now.

And it took the whole lower half, down by Blue Note, took the entrance out on the right side of Blue Note, took most of that property out. So we had to remove that field. So now we only have really one big athletical (sic) field down there. They still have the rope thing through the trees, and then there's a smaller field down by the pond. So there's a slight change there.

Overall, we're disturbing probably about two and a half to three acres in new disturbance, and basically around the interior of the camp, I'll say. The movement back and forth is not disturbing any area that wasn't disturbed before. The biggest buildings are going on existing fields. So with the removal of the big field down at the

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bottom because of the wetlands, we're probably now proposing less disturbance than we had before.

So we have a new application. We have a new SEQR. We have two new applicants. We have a new map. So I think we were asking for this to be circulated and set a public hearing for January.

I asked if you would set it, it's a long ways off, but we have to provide a couple of engineering things to John, the SWPPP, and a few other things. A proof of disturbance, and grade out the fields, and we feel we can do that. So I would hope that if everybody's happy at the workshop, you would go with the public hearing. And then if we don't give you the proof of the pudding at the workshop, we could cancel the public hearing if that happens.

CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Basically, it's similar to what we had last time with buildings. Nothing major, it's just movements of where the building, this building here at the TAC meeting, this field

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    here, but it's nothing --
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         MR. ZIGLER: It's actually less
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    because --
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         CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: It's less.
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         MR. ZIGLER: Yeah. We're disturbing
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     less area. We also had, like, a
