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2	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, this is			
3	Bay View Power House Dance Center. It's a			
4	new application. Mr. Zigler, give us an			
5	update, or just what this is and what we have			
6	to do.			
7	MR. ZIGLER: This is a new application			
8	for Building E and Building A. This is at			
9	the end of Holt Drive. Dave Zigler from			
10	Atzl, Nasher and Zigler.			
11	On E, that you've reviewed that for a			
12	church. Then it became an in use allowable			
13	in the zone. It was what I call a Lego block			
14	item, it was a building that looked like			
15	locks there. Now he's out, and now a dance			
16	studio wants to move and take that whole			
17	unit.			
18	Building A, the next one to the right,			
19	or to the north if you're a Boy Scout, half			
20	of that building is going to become a gym.			
21	So we showed these two items at the workshop.			
22	And we had used the parking criteria for			
23	office for those two items. And Bill			
24	recommended using a recreational, commercial			
25	recreational, recreational. And basically,			

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2 that's a parking criteria that the Planning 3 Board sets. So for both of those, we had 4 come up with over, almost 50 parking spaces 5 for E. And then for the gym, we're around 6 23, I think.

7 So I've done an investigation for the dance studio. And 58, 60 spaces would be 8 9 more than enough. The dance studio works 10 hour to hour. The kids come in ten minutes 11 before, dropped off, and then the kids that are there, of course, leave after the hour. 12 13 So the cars, because they're coming and 14 going, they just kind of miss each other. 15 And as far as the parking there, they run 16 maybe 20 kids at the most. So the amount of 17 parking spaces they need for operation is 18 very little.

19Right now, they're down by Burger King20and 9W, next to the post office. And then21around that site right now is probably a22maximum of about 25, 30 spaces. So leaving23it at that office which is 58, 60, you can24say 60 parking spaces would be enough for25their operation. And it's up to the Board,

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2	according to the code, to pick the parking.			
3	So that's that. And the additional			
4	change is the gym in Building A, the lower			
5	portion of it. And that would end up being			
6	probably around 12 spaces. But the whole			
7	building would probably be around 23 spaces.			
8	So it's something we can discuss at the			
9	workshop, or you can discuss and come up with			
10	a parking criteria for it. But whatever			
11	happens, if you pick 60 or 70 or whatever, we			
12	would ask that it be, if I come back for a			
13	site plan with something else, that that			
14	could be clarified by a parking study. So in			
15	other words, if a year from now we come in			
16	and put a nine-story building in there, we			
17	can do a parking study on what each one of			
18	these users are using so that we would have			
19	a, you know, hard numbers which we don't have			
20	now. We would put a note on the map to that			
21	effect.			
22	The other thing is through the middle of			

23 the parking lot is a drainage system, the
24 Town of Stony Point's drainage system right
25 there with the easement over it, which

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2	doesn't show the easement right now. But		
3	that was actually part of the town line		
4	project, and the town line project is off the		
5	map about right here. And as you know,		
6	that's coming back in.		
7	But with discussion with the Town		
8	Engineer and being out on the site, he's		
9	recommending that we put that plan, so it		
10	would be Page Two here, of the replacement of		
11	that pipe. And that's all it is. Take that		
12	pipe out, put another pipe in. But it would		
13	be part of this review so that way, when they		
14	get these two C of Os, that the parking lot		
15	would done and sealed. And then when town		
16	line comes in later on, that would be able to		
17	size for that project.		
18	So that's the only changes tonight. And		
19	being that there's nobody within 500 foot of		
20	this, you could circulate it, if you so		
21	choose. And then we were going to ask for a		
22	public hearing.		
23	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: John, you have any?		
24	MR. QUEENAN: Yeah, those are the two		
25	main comments. One, the plan references		

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2	office footage use. That ties into the zone,
3	which ties into the parking calculation. So
4	that's got to get cleaned up.
5	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Right.
6	MR. QUEENAN: And the second one was,
7	yeah, the storm drain which is shown that's
8	going through the center of the parking lot
9	and the connection to the adjacent property,
10	and that should be resited.
11	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. Max?
12	MR. STACH: Yeah. So we had that same
13	concern with the parking. We felt that this
14	was a very similar use to the Cheer Mania
15	academy that is on the adjacent site. We
16	didn't really have concerns with the use, per
17	se. We noted that it's a Type II action, and
18	therefore, under SEQR, and I would recommend
19	that you make that determination for the
20	record tonight.
21	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. All
22	right, so I need a motion to make this a
23	Type II action.
24	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: I'll make the
25	motion.

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2	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: I need a second.		
3	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: I'll second.		
4	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All in favor?		
5	(Response of aye was given.)		
6	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Opposed? All right		
7	so we'll make this a Type II. Yeah, and		
8	also, I'm going to need a motion to set a		
9	public hearing for the next available		
10	meeting, which is		
11	MR. ZIGLER: One question. Since there		
12	is an open issue, it's not a hard number on		
13	dance, it may need further workshop. We'll		
14	submit current class sizes, dance sizes		
15	hourly, and then you can see what they have.		
16	Now, this facility is going to be bigger.		
17	But I think even if you double the numbers,		
18	the 58 or 60 spaces that we're claiming is		
19	more than enough.		
20	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, yeah.		
21	That sounds good. So set the I need a		
22	motion to set the public hearing for next		
23	available meeting, which is July 25th.		
24	BOARD MEMBER ROGERS: I'll make that		
25	motion.		

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2	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: I need a second.
3	BOARD MEMBER FERGUSON: I'll second it.
4	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Any discussion? All
5	in favor?
6	(Response of aye was given.)
7	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Opposed? All right.
8	So July 25th, we'll see you, and you'll have
9	those changes with the maps.
10	MR. ZIGLER: Yes.
11	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Thank you.
12	MR. ZIGLER: You're welcome.
