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2	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. The next
3	application is Eagle Bay. This is just a
4	review. This is a site plan, conditional
5	use, north end of Hudson Drive and Tomkins
6	Avenue.
7	MS. MELE: Good evening, everybody. My
8	name is Amy Mele, 4 Laurel Road, New City,
9	New York. I'm the attorney for the applicant
10	Eagle Bay.
11	What we're hoping tonight is to get the
12	Board's feedback by, and a referral to the
13	ARB this evening. As you may recall, the
14	Town was nice enough to set up a special
15	workshop for us last month, or actually
16	earlier this month, with some members of each
17	of the Boards that we have to deal with, so
18	that we could go through the plans in a
19	little bit more detail.
20	And we listened to what you had to say
21	at that meeting. Some of the things that we
22	had heard previously was that we weren't
23	showing enough detail on the plan about
24	certain landscaping attributes and whatnot.
25	We did bring a new plan to that meeting.

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2	If I could just go from maybe south to
3	north, we got some feedback that on the south
4	side that perhaps a gazebo and a covered area
5	would be, like, a little bit too much, and
6	that perhaps maybe one structure would be
7	preferable. And we're going to show you in a
8	couple slides some examples of some
9	structures and gazebos that we think you
10	might like.
11	As Mr. Zigler explained at that meeting,
12	we've moved the parking area back and the
13	commercial area back so that we could provide
14	more of the public space in front of the
15	commercial area for people to gather.
16	Everything that's shown in green is basically
17	what we're going to dedicate to the Town in
18	the form of an easement for the public's use
19	and enjoyment.
20	We spent a lot of time on this. We all
21	know that the road has to be 20 feet wide
22	because that's going to be our emergency
23	access. During the workshop, Member Muller
24	pointed out that some of the trees that we
o =	

25 had along that access overlapped, overhung

Proceedings 2 into the roadway, and that could be a problem

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2	into the roadway, and that could be a problem
3	for fire truck access. So we've removed
4	those. And we have smaller plantings along
5	the roadway on the riverside, and benches.
6	We've also included in front of the
7	buildings, and we'll have a screen that we'll
8	show you in a minute, basically what's going
9	to serve as a rain garden, and also a
10	landscaping feature, and also a drainage
11	feature. And I think you'll like what we
12	have in mind.
13	I should also point out in that terms of
14	the landscaping, you, the Board, hired it's
15	own landscape architect, Mr. Lopez. And that
16	our landscape architect, Mr. Sherman, has
17	been back and forth and in touch with
18	Mr. Lopez. So what you're seeing now is a
19	result of their collaborative efforts. He
20	actually has with him tonight a spreadsheet
21	of a planting list of I don't know how many
22	different species. But they're going back
23	and forth now on whether or not they think

24 that those would be appropriate.

So as we move north, you'll see that we 25

2	put in what we call the pergola park. Is
3	that correct, Dave? So if you look to the
4	north, you'll see an area that juts out over
5	the rip rap where there would be another
6	public gathering place with perhaps the
7	pergola, because we thought maybe the
8	pergola, you know, would provide you with
9	some shade but wouldn't necessarily be, you
10	know, something that's constantly shady. And
11	we'll show you some further details of that.
12	Mr. Sherman also, at the suggestion of one of
13	the members, did regrade the public area in
14	front of the commercial space to be more
15	amphitheater-like, and he can explain that in
16	a little more detail if you'd like.
17	And then as you continue further, we
18	have the eagle observatory on the far north
19	end, opposite the battlefield. We also
20	discussed giving the Town an easement to the
21	battlefield over the wetland area in the
22	event that we are ultimately able to develop
23	it and make it a walkway all the way through.
24	So we've done about 1200 feet of walking
25	area.

2	And I don't think a lot of attention
3	been paid to it, but I should point out also
4	that, you know, we have this dock is public.
5	So it's quite a long dock. It's going to
6	have seating. It's going to have areas along
7	it where people can sit and fish and have a
8	sandwich, take in the view. And you'll see
9	the marina there just north of that. So if
10	you could go to the next slide, please.
11	MR. POTANOVIC: Is it possible for the
12	applicant to put a map up? Because we can't
13	really see.
14	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: It's in the back,
15	George.
16	MR. POTANOVIC: It's not. That's that
17	one, but not the first one, the one that
18	shows the detail.
19	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, we'll get
20	you.
21	MR. POTANOVIC: One that shows the
22	front.
23	MS. MELE: I'm sorry. We don't other
24	than the slides, we don't have another map.
25	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, go ahead,

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2 we got it.

3	MS. MELE: Okay. So again, one of the
4	things that we heard at the workshop meeting
5	was that, you know, we had a lot of trees
6	around the lawn area. And one of the
7	comments was that, you know, they could get
8	big and they could kind of encroach upon the
9	lawn area, make it smaller. So we actually
10	removed some and left some more areas open.
11	As you can see in this rendering,
12	there's no other structure other than the
13	bandstand and gazebo. And that's right in
14	front of one of the tile basins. And there
15	will be, you know, other landscaping along
16	the rip rap area. I think we can go to the
17	next slide, please.
18	So the rain gardens. Here are some
19	examples of Mr. Sherman's work. And this is
20	what he and your landscape architect are
21	discussing now. So, you know, I know a lot
22	of people hear a rain garden, they think oh,
23	you know, it's just going to be some
24	detention basin.
25	No, these are going to be really

25 No, these are going to be really

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2	attractive rain gardens. And they are
3	basically going back and forth because there
4	is, it is sandy soil. We're making sure that
5	the plants that we put in there are going to
6	survive in the sandy soil. And so they've
7	been discussing that offline. But we wanted
8	to give you a preview what that could look
9	like. And they're rather large.
10	We can go back to the first slide. If
11	you can just go to the next slide, please.
12	So here are some different concepts, concept
13	ideas for the gazebos. I think what we have
14	is about a 25-foot sort of hexagonal or
15	octagonal gazebo. I'm sorry?
16	So, but these are the type of things
17	that the Architectural Review Board would
18	look at. So we're open to different ideas
19	and different concepts. But we wanted to
20	give you an idea of what it could possibly
21	look like. Go on to the next slide, please.
22	And then the pergola feature was a
23	result, again, also of our meeting. And we
24	felt that that could be a nice, a nice
25	feature. I think one of the things that we

1 Proceedings discussed at the meeting and I think 2 3 everybody kind of came to terms with was that we wanted to, you know, it's going to be sort 4 5 of like a passive park, but that's it's going 6 to be inviting. And we wanted to get people 7 down to the end, and we want to have people 8 use it. And so this is what we thought was 9 an inviting feature that we could include in 10 that. If you could just go to the next slide. 11 Is that it? Okay. We can go back to the 12 13 first one, then. 14 So what we'd like tonight is what we 15 discussed at the workshop, is we'd like to 16 get a referral to the ARB. I think what will 17 probably happen is will be two ARB meetings. 18 One will be about the buildings and the materials and whatnot, and the other will be 19 20 about probably landscape and lighting. 21 So we'd like to get there as soon as 22 possible to start talking about these things. 23 And we just, as we stated at the workshop, 24 want a confirmation that this, this general layout concept plan is something that works 25

2	for the Planning Board because that's what
3	we're going to be continuing to develop as we
4	go to the ARB, and as we go to this Board,
5	and as we complete the environmental impact
6	statement.
7	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: In your earlier
8	discussion tonight, you said you're going to
9	show us pictures with and without the
10	pavilion.
11	MS. MELE: Yeah.
12	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: You showed us
13	without the pavilion, but you haven't shown
14	us anything with the pavilion.
15	MS. MELE: Well, this one
16	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: That's just the
17	bandstand. It doesn't include the pavilion.
18	MS. MELE: Right, but I thought that's
19	what the Board wanted, was less structures in
20	that one area.
21	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: No.
22	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: That's what we
23	talked about at the TAC meeting.
24	MS. MELE: Okay.
25	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: Can I just say

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2 something?

3 MS. MELE: Sure. 4 BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: That was one of 5 the issues that was brought up at the TAC 6 meeting. Nothing she's talking about here 7 now is set in stone. I think what you're looking to do is get to the ARB. From our 8 9 perspective is the idea of are we satisfied 10 with your presentation of the public area. I think when you go to the ARB and hopefully, 11 you will be back to us and say, and let us 12 13 know also how you're doing with them. 14 MS. MELE: Right. 15 BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: Then at that 16 point, we can talk whether it's a gazebo or a 17 pavilion. 18 MS. MELE: Yeah. I mean, we could put 19 the pavilion back in. 20 BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: Well, that would be brought up in the future. 21 MS. MELE: I think there was maybe some 22 23 debate about whether the gazebo and the 24 pavilion were a little much, or whether you wanted just one or the other. But we're 25

2	willing to do whatever the Board is looking
3	for. We'd just like to just get the
4	discussion started.
5	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: Yeah, but when you
6	come back to us and tell us we're going to
7	put a bandstand, or we're going to put a
8	pavilion, you know, even on the rough plan in
9	the future, if you know, we did talk about
10	it at the TAC meeting.
11	MS. MELE: Right.
12	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: And all the
13	members weren't at the TAC meeting.
14	MS. MELE: Correct.
15	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: I remember
16	stating, the question was, it would be less
17	intrusive to have a bandstand type of thing
18	compared to a bigger
19	MS. MELE: I'm sorry, say that one more
20	time?
21	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: We were looking
22	at, we were looking at the structure being
23	smaller.
24	MS. MELE: Okay, yeah. And the
25	supervisor did indicate also that, and I

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2	tried to take the bandstand off of there
3	before tonight, but the plans were already
4	drawn. But he did indicate that you have
5	concerts at other town parks, and that he
6	wouldn't think that there would be concerts
7	at this particular location. So it's not
8	really a bandstand. It's more of a covered
9	area where people can sit.
10	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. I think,
11	I know at the last meeting, marked green was
12	the public area. So on these maps, you're
13	showing the public area. It may not be the
14	detail of what, but it's the general outlook
15	of how the public area is going from, what
16	was it, north to south, and over by where the
17	restaurant is, the deck. I know we were
18	concerned that they went on the deck of the
19	restaurant, the patio, they would be able to
20	have a good look, a view of the river. I
21	know you were addressing that part over
22	there, and then along the walkway with the
23	plantings.
24	But I think right now, what our main

25 concern tonight is are we okay with the

2 general layout to send you to the -- that's 3 what we're looking to see, if the general 4 layout of the site and the public area is 5 something that we're okay with. And then 6 once you go to the ARB and come back to us, 7 then you'll have more details of this looks good here, this is too much here. And then 8 9 you have, I guess the dock with the benches. 10 So I think tonight, we're just -- we 11 have more detail than we had last time. 12 That's I think what we were looking for, just 13 to see the public area of what it would look 14 like. Go ahead. 15 BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: What's the total 16 square footage of the public area, or acres, 17 and how much of that is --18 MS. MELE: 2 point --MR. ZIGLER: Yeah, it's like 1-3, 1-5, 19 20 because of --21 BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: And how much is 22 the rain garden?

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23 MR. SHERMAN: That was not included. 24 The 1.39 acres is just lawn, lawns. 25 BOARD MEMPER JASLOW: Okay thank you

25 BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: Okay, thank you.

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2	MR. ZIGLER: From the edge going east,
3	no rain gardens.
4	MR. SHERMAN: And I didn't count the
5	road.
6	BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: Good.
7	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. All
8	right. John, do you have any comments?
9	MR. QUEENAN: Just on this, no.
10	MS. MELE: On this right now?
11	MR. QUEENAN: They've been working with
12	the Town's landscape architect and their
13	architect. I think we're good at this point.
14	If the Board has any specific concerns, you
15	could always pass them along.
16	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: We would pass them
17	along. Max?
18	MR. STACH: So my two major concerns
19	that I brought up at the TAC meeting were
20	that there's a workable plan for extending
21	this path to both the north and south. And I
22	believe the applicant has committed to
23	showing easements and at least the concept of
24	how that would be done.
25	MS. MELE: Correct.

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2	MR. STACH: And also that whatever
3	restaurant or public commercial use is there,
4	that that use has a good view of the river
5	because that's what's going to draw people
6	down here. So that, you know, plantings and
7	gazebos and everything else that's happening
8	right in front is great, but it shouldn't
9	undermine, you know, the value of that sort
10	of commercial enterprise to bring the public
11	down there and be able to enjoy it.
12	MS. MELE: We agree with you.
13	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: I would like to
14	see when you come back next time, like you
15	did for the gazebo, you had different
16	layouts, I'd like to see the same thing for
17	the pavilion, please.
18	MS. MELE: The pavilion, sure. Would
19	you like to see both gazebo and pavilion, and
20	then just pavilion and just gazebo?
21	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: I think that
22	would be good.
23	MS. MELE: Okay.
24	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: Yes, please.
25	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Thank you. Let me

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2	go to the Fire Inspector. Tom, for the
3	MR. LARKIN: Well, some of the things
4	that were talked about at the TAC meeting,
5	we're hoping to come to a decision on the
6	amount of public area tonight.
7	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Right.
8	MR. LARKIN: And to indicate the
9	easement from the eagles' nest to the
10	battlefield.
11	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Correct. All right,
12	thanks.
13	MR. LARKIN: It's on the map.
14	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: It's on the map.
15	It's what we're going to look for on the map.
16	And I know the and also with the 20-foot
17	walkway around that it's got to be accessible
18	by a fire truck. And we were worried about
19	the look, that it wouldn't be just black,
20	like, asphalt. It would be something
21	different.
22	MS. MELE: Yes. We're looking into
23	different types of material, or perhaps
24	varying it in some way. Something that could
25	support the weight of a fire truck, but also

2	be esthetically pleasing.
3	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right.
4	MR. LARKIN: Mr. Chairman, currently
5	we've got products still under review.
6	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Okay.
7	MR. LARKIN: All right. The proposed
8	product for the
9	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: The one product that
10	they were looking for the fire trucks.
11	MR. LARKIN: It's still under review.
12	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: When they put the
13	legs down, right?
14	MR. LARKIN: Yes. We're still looking
15	at the users list.
16	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Okay, good. Thanks,
17	Tom. Does the Board have any other
18	questions?
19	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: You're going to
20	put the 50-foot easement on the next set of
21	maps, correct?
22	MS. MELE: To the battlefield?
23	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: Yes.
24	MS. MELE: Yes.
25	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. Go

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2 ahead.

3	MR. HONAN: Just for clarification of
4	what we discussed at the TAC meeting, I
5	believe that there probably should be a
6	separate sheet, separate plan that shows the
7	extent of the public area, like a survey.
8	And then with that, have the right-of-way and
9	easements to the south and the north for
10	future hook up.
11	And with respect to the actual
12	structures, it was my understanding that that
13	was not going to be put in the plan at this
14	time. That's something that's going to be a

15 little more flexible. And then as you get 16 further down the line, you can indicate where 17 and to what extent there will be recreational 18 structures there.

MS. MELE: Sure. Well, you can always change that. I think that a trip to the ARB would be useful in that to the extent we're talking about these structures, if they like a certain sort of look, let's say they like it, you know, aged cedar, or they want it to be white PVC or whatever, then we can at

1 Proceedings least know, you know, what we're talking 2 3 about when we're talking about putting the structures back. But certainly, this Board 4 5 has the authority to tell us, you know, what 6 they want to see and where. 7 And again, I think our first visit to 8 the ARB is really going to be about the 9 buildings. And then we'll get more into the 10 landscape and lighting. And we'd be happy to 11 come back and give you an update on how those 12 meetings are going. 13 MR. HONAN: I think what the Planning 14 Board had indicated was that they would like 15 a survey of the public areas so at least they 16 know what they're dealing with from meeting

17 to meeting.

18 MS. MELE: And yes, we're going to have 19 to do that, anyway. And you and I are going 20 to have to, as we discussed, the devil's 21 going to be in the details on that one. But 22 you and I are going to have to discuss the 23 easement itself. But yeah, we can start 24 coming up with the metes and bounds for the easement. And for the easement to the north, 25

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2	we'll show that on the next map.			
3	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right. Any			
4	other questions? And I know for we go to			
5	the ARB for the buildings. I know the			
6	mechanicals on the roof, I think that was a			
7	concern the Building Inspector brought up so			
8	that, you know, we have a kind of layout of			
9	what things are going to look like.			
10	MS. MELE: Okay.			
11	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, anything			
12	else? All right. If that's good, what we'll			
13	do is I'll make a motion to send them to the			
14	ARB. And this is just to get an overall,			
15	overall assessment of the public area and the			
16	layout. So I need a motion to send them to			
17	the ARB.			
18	BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: I'll make the			
19	motion.			
20	BOARD MEMBER FERGUSON: I'll second it.			
21	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Second. Any			
22	discussion? All right, Mary, just poll the			
23	Board.			
24	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: They're going to			
25	the ARB for landscaping and lighting.

3	MS. MELE: And building design.
4	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: What?
5	MS. MELE: Building design.
6	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Yeah.
7	THE CLERK: Mr. Muller?
8	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: Yes.
9	THE CLERK: Mr. Jaslow?
10	BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: Yes.
11	THE CLERK: Mr. Ferguson?
12	BOARD MEMBER FERGUSON: Yes.
13	THE CLERK: Mr. Rogers?
14	BOARD MEMBER ROGERS: Yes.
15	THE CLERK: Mr. Kraese?
16	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: Yes.
17	THE CLERK: Chairman Gubitosa?
18	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Yes. All right.
19	Anything else tonight?
20	MS. MELE: No. Should I just contact
21	Mary directly to talk about getting on an
22	agenda for the ARB?
23	THE CLERK: You can just call me
24	tomorrow.
25	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Yes. And just, and

1	Proceedings
2	I think whatever you get to the ARB, just
3	make sure I get a copy so I see what's going
4	on.
5	MS. MELE: Absolutely.
6	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, thank
7	you.
8	MS. MELE: Thank you.
9	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, the next
10	item on the agenda is Bay View Park Power
11	House Dance Center.
12	MR. HONAN: There's one other issue,
13	Amy, before you step down. I just are the
14	Members of the Board at this time satisfied
15	with the extent of the public area that's
16	shown on the plan that was just on the
17	screen?
18	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: I'll take another
19	I guess I'll poll the Board. For the public
20	area that was shown, is the Planning Board
21	okay with the way they showed, I guess the
22	whole public area, not detail, but the layout
23	of the public area?
24	MR. HONAN: The extent, basically, the
25	square footage.

2	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: The square footage.
3	BOARD MEMBER JASLOW: Yes.
4	VICE CHAIRMAN MULLER: Yes.
5	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Eric, yes. Pete,
6	yes. I'm yes.
7	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: I'm satisfied what
8	they're showing us today, yes.
9	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Yes.
10	BOARD MEMBER ROGERS: Yes.
11	BOARD MEMBER FERGUSON: Yes.
12	BOARD MEMBER KRAESE: And it's not
13	final.
14	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: Right, it's not
15	final. Just of the concept.
16	MS. MELE: No, we appreciate you
17	clarifying that. Thank you very much.
18	CHAIRMAN GUBITOSA: All right, good.
