Stony Point Ambulance Report

May Call Stats

Stony Point Ambulance received a total of 146 calls for service, 34 of those calls were provided to neighboring towns via our mutual aid plan and received 7 calls into Stony Point via other corps providing mutual aid to Stony Point when we were on another call or even out on two calls already.

We provided standby crews for the following events:

All of this was covered while we continued to provide 911 coverage to our town.

We began staffing 2 rigs on the weekends to be able to respond to the influx of calls during the summer months particularly in the parks.

We are proud to say that although we have paid staff to supplement our volunteers, we are able to continue covering more than 70% of our shifts and calls with volunteers.

We are always looking for new volunteers. We have an active youth squad that takes members at 14 years of age, our association which is comprised of our riding members and looking for drivers and folks interested in becoming an EMT (free training), and our auxiliary which are our non-riding members who support our mission.
