Proposed Local Law Tax Levy Override

The following Public Notice was properly posted:

TOWN OF STONY POINT NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on 10th day of October, 2017, at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, a Public Hearing will be held before the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point, New York, at the Rho Building, located at 5 Clubhouse Lane, Stony Point, New York, to consider a Local Law, authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law § 3-c. The purpose of this Local Law is to allow the Town of Stony Point to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Stony Point and to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law § 3-c.

The full text of the proposed Local Law is on file in the Town Clerk's Office, 74 East Main Street, Stony Point, New York, and may be obtained by any interested parties from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

Action

At 7:32 pm a motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to open the public hearing.

<u>Supervisor Monaghan</u> presented a very brief overview of the reason for this public hearing and proposed local law.

<u>William Beckman, Assessor</u> gave an overview of the process used for determining tax rates in Stony Point. At present there is a 5% increase in the tax levy but a 0% increase in residential tax rates and a decrease in the tax rate for commercial. This is because our tax base has risen substantially.

There would be no penalty to homeowners or the Town if we go override the tax levy limit. The only rebate this year is for STAR and that's related to school taxes, not town taxes.

<u>Supervisor Monahan</u> commended every department head for doing more with less.

<u>Councilman White</u> asked if the Town goes over the tax cap does it affect any other programs, grants, etc.

<u>Brian Nugent, Special Counsel</u> advised that there are no consequences to the Town or to the tax payers, regarding any rebates because those programs are either expired or do not affect the Town but rather the school district. Spoke with the Comptroller's Office this morning and was advised that there are no adverse or negative affects to the tax payer.

<u>Councilman Basile</u> recapped by saying that the vote taken tonight is not to override the tax cap; it gives us the ability to override it if necessary as we continue to move thru the budget process.

Brian Nugent, Special Counsel

This is done as a precaution unless you are abundantly clear that you are not exceeding the cap.

Public Input

Lou Silver, 136 West Main St. inquired about the assessment on the pipeline.

<u>George Potanovic</u>, Old Gate Hill Rd. spoke about the values of properties along the pipeline.

<u>Susan Filgueras</u>, Tomkins Cove asked how CSX Railroad and electric lines running under Rt. 9W would be taxed.

<u>Deirdre</u> O'Connor, 3 Cross St., thanked the Town for keeping the taxes down and spoke of the need for the town and school district to start functioning as one community.

<u>John Gazzola</u>, Liberty Ridge spoke about the proposed CHPE line, agreeing with the Rockland County Times editorial to leave the line in the river.

<u>Gregg Jullian</u> – Tomkins Cove having been a former school member, spoke with current members and the statement that the district will be bankrupt soon is frivolous.

Close Public Hearing

At 8:12 pm a motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and unanimously carried by a voice vote of those board members present to close this public hearing.

Resolution - Proposed Local Law Tax Levy Override

The following resolution was duly offered by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Puccio and carried by a voice vote of those board members present, with Councilman White voting no; to wit:

RESOLUTION 2017/18

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD FOR THE TOWN OF STONY POINT, NEW YORK ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2017 AUTHORIZING A PROPERTY TAX LEVY IN EXCESS OF THE LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW § 3-C

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point, New York ("Town Board") duly noticed a public hearing held on October 10, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board solicited public comment during a public hearing held on October 10, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Local Law is to authorize the Town Board to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town and to further allow the Town Board to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing on January 1, 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the tax levy limit in accordance with General Municipal Law § 3-c.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

<u>Section 1.</u> The above "WHEREAS" paragraphs are incorporated herein by reference.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Local Law Authorizing A Property Tax Levy In Excess of The Limit Established in General Municipal Law § 3-C as attached hereto as Schedule "A" be and hereby is adopted as Local Law No.3 of 2017 of the Town of Stony Point on October 10, 2017.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Town Board hereby directs the Town Clerk to take all steps to process and file said Local Law as amended.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

Local Law No. 3 of 2017

TOWN OF STONY POINT LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2017

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING A PROPERTY TAX LEVY IN EXCESS OF THE LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW § 3-C

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York ("Town Board") as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

It is the intent of this Local Law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Stony Point ("Town") and to allow the Town to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law § 3-c.

Section 2. Authority.

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law § 3-c, which expressly authorizes the Town to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of the Town Board.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override.

The Town Board is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law § 3-c.

Section 4. Severability.

If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Local Law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

PRESENTATION - ROSE MEMORIAL LIBRARY

Library Director James Mahoney and Trustees Jennifer Lima and Christina Mendara gave a presentation to the Town Board regarding the Library's proposed plan to purchase the former school building on West Main Street as the new site for the library. Audience members, Town Board members and Library personnel engaged in conversation and discussions regarding the proposal.

Create Position of Code Enforcement Officer 1

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to create the position of Code Enforcement Officer 1.

Hire Park Attendants

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to hire Elizabeth Fox and Ashley Morales as Park Attendants at \$9.70 per hour effective October 7, 2017.

<u>Create Position Senior Groundsworker (Non-Competitive)</u>

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to create the position of Senior Groundsworker (non-competitive) in the Parks Department at the rate of \$23.60 per hour.

Amend Purchase Order #3021

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to amend Purchase Order #3021that was approved by the Town Board on September 12, 2017 and issued to Dykes Lumber in the amount of \$20,488.98. The actual amount of the purchase order was \$19,998.45.

Review 2018 Tentative Budget

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to adjust the 2018 Tentative Budget as presented on September 26, 2017 by increasing revenue by \$108,000 and taking \$225,000 from the General Fund Reserve.

Set Public Hearing – 2018 Preliminary Budget

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Javenes and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to set a public hearing for the Preliminary Budget for October 24, 2017 at 7:00 pm.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 9:30 pm a motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present to adjourn to executive session to discuss financial obligations with the ambulance corp. No further votes will be taken.

AD.IOURN

The October 10, 2017 Stony Point Town Board meeting adjourned at 10:30 pm and no additional votes were taken.
