## STONY POINT TOWN BOARD MEETING - October 12, 2021

The Town Board of the Town of Stony Point convened in Regular Session on Tuesday, October 12, 2021, at 7:00pm at the Stony Point Community Center (Rho Building), 5 Clubhouse Lane, Stony Point, NY. Supervisor Monaghan called the meeting to order and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

# SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Supervisor Monaghan reported as follows:

- Good news that the Stony Point Center will not be selling after suffering a great loss during the pandemic. The center has been a great benefit to the Town throughout the years.
- Still working to "Save Camp Bullawa"
  - County Executive Ed Day has committed \$10,000,000.00 to preserve open space in the county.

## Present Tentative Budget

I am happy to present the 2022 tentative budget. This town board has had to make difficult decisions for both the safety and financial security of our town. Working with a great team I am proud of the accomplishments that we have achieved during such difficult times. Our 2022 tentative budget calls for a 3.02% Reduction in our homeowner's town taxes and a 5% reduction for our businesses.

Some of the key points that the budget provides for:

- \$367,000 for paving and additional funding for much needed highway equipment, including a plow truck and 2 mason dump trucks.
- Funding for police vehicles and equipment
- Parks Department equipment. Including additional funding for playground equipment. Currently we have \$121,000 earmarked for playground equipment plus an additional budgeted \$50,000. Also, we anticipate a grant award for additional playground equipment.
- Additionally, we have earmarked additional funding through the general fund for our ambulance corp. for future payroll needs.

This budget could not have been achieved without working together with our finance director, our department heads, and our hard-working town employees.
