## **SUPERVISOR'S REPORT**

Supervisor Monaghan reported as follows:

With more vaccines distributed, we continue to move in the right direction. However, we must continue to remain vigilant regarding the safety measures we have put in place to ensure our health. There are currently 80 confirmed cases of covid-19 in the town of Stony Point including 3 Town employees who have tested positive for the virus. We had to temporarily close access to town hall to protect the safety of the public and our employees. Currently Town Hall is open to the public with a limited staff. I would like to thank our Recreation Director Karenanne Nigro who has been working with our Stony Point seniors to help navigate the vaccine process, so far, we have been able to assist approximately 25 seniors obtain appointments for the vaccine. Unfortunately, we do not have special access to the vaccine however we continue to work together in helping more of our residents obtain the vaccine.

Tonight's 6pm NYS Department of Transportation's zoom information meeting on the design of the PIP bridge improvements was postponed. I was informed that the meeting will be rescheduled a few weeks from now with the date to be determined, soon as we have that information, we will post it on our Town Web Site.

At our January Town Board meeting the Town Board authorized the hiring of an outside appraisal company to do an independent appraisal of our town Golf Course. I anticipate that the appraisal will be finalized and available to the public possibly as soon as this week. Once the appraisal is finalized, I will have the appraisal available on our town web site. If the Town should sell the property and I believe it is in the best interest of the town to do so, we would require the following from the purchaser:

- That the Golf Course remain as a Golf Course -open and available to our residents.
- That the purchaser pays for and build a new recreation community center for our residents and seniors.
- The removal or renovation of the existing Letchworth buildings, keeping the Kirkbride building available for recreational gym use.

We have a lot on tonight's agenda including two public comment sessions, including a public comment session on the NYS Police Reform and Reinvention Collaboration and a continued public hearing on our zoning amendments. Prior to opening the public comment session, I will make a brief statement.
