STONY POINT TOWN BOARD MEETING - May 11, 2021

The Town Board of the Town of Stony Point convened in Regular Session on Tuesday, May 11, 2021 at 7:00pm at the Stony Point Community Center (Rho Building), 5 Clubhouse Lane, Stony Point, NY. Supervisor Monaghan called the meeting to order and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Supervisor Monaghan stated that tonight's meeting was being aired on Facebook Live.

Proclamation Police Week

Supervisor Monaghan read the following proclamation and praised the Police Department for the great work that they do:

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States of America has designated the week of May 9-15, 2021 to be dedicated as "National Police Week" and May 15th of each year to be "Peace Officers' Memorial Day", and

WHEREAS Police Officers' Memorial Day is to be dedicated to Police Officers who have died in the line of duty, and

WHEREAS, the International Association of Chiefs of Police has requested that all municipalities honor Police Officers' Memorial Day by flying all flags within the municipality at half-mast.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Monaghan, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Supervisor of the Town of Stony Point, hereby proclaim May 9th through May 15th, 2021 as Police Week in the Town of Stony Point and in honor of those Police Officers who have died in the line of duty in this Country, all flags in the Town of Stony Point shall be flown at half-mast on May 15th, 2021.

I DO FURTHER call upon all our citizens to make every effort to express their thanks to our men and women who make it possible for us to leave our homes knowing they are protected by men and women willing to sacrifice their lives, if necessary, to guard our loved ones, property and government against all who would violate the law.

IN RECOGNITION THEREOF, I affix my signature and the Seal of the Town of Stony Point to this proclamation this 11th day of May in the year of Our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-one.

<u>Councilman Basile</u> stated there has been an epidemic of Police suicide due to the emotional strain on Police Officers and asked for our prayers.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Supervisor Monaghan reported as follows:

- Chief Moore has announced he will be retiring after 41 years with the Stony Point Police Department, 10 years as Chief, and thanked him for all his years of service.
- This year the annual Memorial Day Parade is cancelled due to Covid. There will be a wreath laying ceremony held on Memorial Day at Town Hall at 9am.
- A misleading and irresponsible post on Social Media about the contract of sale of the Golf Course labeled "Fact Sheet". He continued to discredit the misinformation of said "Fact Sheet" line by line.

Supervisor Monaghan asked the Board if they had comments.

<u>Councilman Basile</u> commented on the irresponsibility of candidates putting outposts on social media riddled with falsehoods for political gain and warned the audience to be careful what they read. The Town Board worked hard on negotiations for the Golf Course sale to get what is best for our residents.

<u>Supervisor Monaghan</u> stated the need to subsidize the Golf Course from the General Fund and in order to maintain the property, it would be necessary to bond a significant amount.

<u>Councilman Puccio</u> stated the Golf Course has been subsidized for 20 years leaving other facilities, such as the Sewer Plant and Highway Department and our roads, neglected for years.

Councilman Javenes agreed.

<u>Councilman Joachim</u> stated he golfs on the course frequently and it is desperately in need of repair. He is looking forward to Patriot Hills LLC taking over and investing in the course.
