Supervisor Monaghan presented the following proclamation:

Town of Stony Point, NY Proclamation HONORING ALS AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by many as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive fatal neurodegenerative disease in which a person's brain loses connection with the muscles, slowly taking away their ability to walk, talk, eat, and eventually breathe; and

WHEREAS, every 90 minutes someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; and

WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from the time of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, ALS has no cure; and

WHEREAS, people who have served in the military are more likely to develop ALS and die from the disease than those with no history of military service; and

WHEREAS, securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment, and communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, clinical trials play a pivotal role in evaluating new treatments, enhancing quality of life, and fostering assistive technologies for those living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, the ALS Association, as the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research globally, has committed over \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the United States and 18 other countries; and

WHEREAS, our commitment to accelerating the pace of discovery remains unwavering, fueled by the hope that one day, ALS will be a livable disease for everyone, everywhere, until we can cure it.

WHEREAS, ALS Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of people with ALS' dire circumstances, and acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has, not only on the person but on his or her family and the community, and recognizes the research being done to eradicate this disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Monaghan, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Supervisor of the Town of Stony Point do hereby proclaim the month of May 2024 as ALS Awareness Month in the Town of Stony Point. I call upon all Americans to join in supporting ALS research, advocating for increased funding, and standing in solidarity with those affected by this relentless disease.

WHEREAS, a written Petition dated **March 25, 2024** signed and acknowledged by **Jose Vargas**, has been presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point requesting the Extension of a sanitary sewer and laterals in a proposed Extension of District **#3** to be known as the Extension of Sanitary Sewer District **#3** as more particularly described in said Petition, and

WHEREAS, the map and plan aforesaid has been approved by the State Department of Health, and copies thereof filed with said Department, and with the Town Clerk, pursuant to Section 192 of the Town Law.

Now on motion of **Supervisor Monaghan**, seconded by **Councilman Williams** all members present voting therefore, it is

FOUND, ORDERED AN DETERMINED that said petition dated **March 25, 2024** for the creation of the Extension of Sanitary Sewer District **#3** in the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York, is signed, approved and acknowledged, as required by law, and is otherwise sufficient and complies with the provision of Section 191 of the Town Law, constituting Chapter 62 of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York, and such other sections of said chapter as are applicable thereto; and that there is annexed to said petition a map and plans showing the boundaries of the proposed Extension of Sanitary Sewer District **#3** and a general plan of the proposed district, and it is

FOUND, ORDERED AND DETERMINED by the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point that it is in the public interest to grant the whole relief sought by said petition, and that all of the property, property owners and interested persons within said proposed Extension of District #3 are benefited thereby, and that all property, or property owners benefited are included therein, and that no property or property owners or interested persons benefited thereby have been excluded therefrom, and it is

ORDERED that the petition for the creation of the extension of Sanitary Sewer District #3 be established in said Town of Stony Point, as described in said petition, may and plan, to be known as the Extension of Sanitary Sewer District #3 and to include the following property:

All that certain plot, piece or parcel of land with the buildings and improvements thereon erected, situate, lying and being in the town of Stony Point, County of Rockland, State of New York and being more particularly known and designated as Lot Nos 1 through 8, inclusive, on that certain map entitled "Final Subdivision for Jessup Valley", and filed in the Rockland County Clerk's Office on August 9, 2007, as Map No. 7941.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF STONY POINT

AUTHORIZING THE SUPERVISOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE DICHTER LAW FIRM IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROPOSED RATE INCREASES BY ORANGE & ROCKLAND UTILITIES, INC., A WHOLLY OWNED SUBSIDIARY OF CONSOLIDATED EDISON CORPORATION, BEFORE THE NYS PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION AS PART OF A MUNICIPAL COALITION IN SUPPORT OF JUST AND REASONABLE RATES

WHEREAS, Orange & Rockland Utilities, Inc. ("O&R") is seeking a rate increase in electric and gas delivery in pending proceedings before the New York Public Service Commission ("the Public Service Commission") (Cases 24-E-0060/24-G-0061); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Stony Point ("Town") seeks to represent the interests of its residents and businesses to ensure that utility rates imposed upon the Town, its residents, and merchants are just and reasonable; and

WHEREAS, a Coalition comprised of various municipalities in Rockland County including Rockland Green, the Rockland County Sewer District, the Town of Clarkstown, Town of Haverstraw, Town of Orangetown, and the Town of Ramapo seek to present a unified voice on behalf of local municipalities and residents thereof before the Public Service Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Town requires an expert in the field of utility rate cases before the Public Service Commission to review, consult and prepare opposition to the proposed rate increases by O&R on behalf of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Dichter Law Firm is qualified with specific qualifications and background in utility rate cases and has been engaged by other municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Dichter Law Firm has agreed to provide such services as outlined in the May 10, 2024, letter, and the share of the Town's legal fees is an initial cap of \$1,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town ("Town Board") desires the scope of legal services that the Dichter Law Firm will provide as special counsel for the purposes of the proceedings pending before the Public Service Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved by the Town Board as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. All "WHEREAS" paragraphs are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full herein.
- Section 2. For the rates set forth therein, for a total amount not to exceed \$1,500.00, the Dichter Law Firm shall perform all services outlined in the letter dated May 10, 2024.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Dichter Law Firm shall submit invoices on a monthly basis summarizing work performed in the prior month.
- Section 4. The Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute the attached letter agreement with the Dichter Law Firm authorizing the above work to be performed and to otherwise take necessary actions to facilitate the provisions of the Agreement.
- <u>Section 5</u>. Any other duties and/or services to be provided by the Dichter Law Firm shall be as approved by Town Board Resolution and for such amount as approved by the Town Board.
- <u>Section 6</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
