#### SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Supervisor Monaghan reported as follows:

Today is the 101<sup>st</sup> day since the first reported Covid-19 case in New York. The positive news is that all the metrics continue to go in the right direction. We are seeing the lower levels in all phases since March 16<sup>th</sup>. The death toll and number of new Covid-19 cases have fallen to their lowest point since the crisis started. Today, Rockland County has reached the metrics to open Phase 2 which includes: Outdoor dining at our local restaurants, barber shops and hair salons, retail stores, real estate and houses of worship can allow occupancy up to 25%.

# RESOLUTION 2020/11 RESOLUTION REGARDING TEMPORARY OUTDOOR DINING

Town Board Minutes June 9, 2020

#### IN THE TOWN OF STONY POINT

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Executive Orders issued by the Governor of the State of New York in addition to interim guidance issued by the New York State Department of Health, temporary outdoor dining has been authorized for restaurant/food service establishments and other food concessions ("Food Vendors") in regions that have entered Phase 2 in the New York Forward Program; and

**WHEREAS**, in the interest of promoting and supporting the local businesses in the Town of Stony Point by authorizing such operations in accordance with all applicable New York State Regulations as well as State and Local Department of Health Regulations.

#### **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:**

- <u>Section 1</u>. The above "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated herein by reference.
- Section 2. Subject to compliance with any and all regulations of the State of New York Department of Health, the Rockland County Department of Health, and, if applicable, the New York State Liquor Authority, and as authorized by the Governor of the State of New York, Food Vendors may operate outdoor dining on private property without the need for any specific approval from the Town of Stony Point.
- <u>Section 3</u>. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

#### Request for Use of Soundstage & Kirkbride for Drive-In Movie Series

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Basile and unanimously carried by a voice vote of those board members present to approve the request of SPPAL for the use of the soundstage, Kirkbride Hall and surrounding property for a Drive-In Movie series. The events are scheduled for Fridays, June 19<sup>th</sup>, July 10<sup>th</sup> and August 14<sup>th</sup> from 6pm to 11pm (No rain dates).

#### **Authorize Recreation Activities Coordinator to Hire Summer Staff**
