## Approve Proposed Resolution-Early Voting

A motion was made by Councilman Basile, seconded by Councilman Puccio and unanimously carried by a voice vote of those board members present, with Supervisor Monaghan being absent, to adopt the following resolution:

#### **RESOLUTION 2019/27**

#### MEMORIALIZING RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND COMMIT TO KEEPING ANY EXCESS COSTS NOT FUNDED BY NEW YORK STATE ASSOCIATED WITH EARLY VOTING AT COUNTY LEVEL

WHEREAS, the State of New York has recently passed legislation implementing early

voting throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, this new early voting will require there to be four polling sites in Rockland, with one expected to be at Stony Point Town Hall open for ten days prior to any primary or general election, which will need to be staffed by paid election workers; and

WHEREAS, the Rockland County Board of Elections will either need to purchase software and equipment for electronic voter books or pay employees, likely on overtime, to

ensure that the voter rolls at each polling location on Election Day are properly

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reflect who voted at the consolidated polling location during the early voting period; and

WHEREAS, these costs of early voting have, at this point not been covered or been

planned to be covered by New York State; and

WHEREAS, Rockland County is legally authorized to engage in the same "unfunded

mandate" process with the Towns as Albany is doing with the Counties in regards to the costs of

this early voting, in that they could force the towns to bear these costs directly; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Elections is a County-level function, having offices and a

budget line at the County level of government; and

WHEREAS, many elected officials in the County of Rockland have repeatedly and

length bemoaned Albany's habit of passing unfunded mandates down to lower levels of government.

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The above "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated herein by reference.
- <u>Section 2</u>. The Town of Stony Point formally requests the County of Rockland commit to keeping any excess costs not funded by New York State associated with early voting, for any and all elections, at the County level of government where those costs rightly belong.
- <u>Section 3</u>. That the Town of Stony Point requests the County of Rockland to cease the continued pushing of unfunded mandates down to the town level of government.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized upon adoption of this Resolution by the Town Board to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the Clerk of the Rockland County Legislature for distribution to all Rockland County Legislators, to Legislator Doug Jobson and to the County Executive for the County of Rockland.
- <u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

### Approve Resolution Authorizing Special Counsel to Represent the Town of Stony Point in Legal Matters

A motion was made by Councilman Basile, seconded by Councilman White and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of those board members present, with Supervisor Monaghan being absent, to adopt the following resolution:

## **RESOLUTION 2019/28**

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SPECIAL COUNSEL TO REPRESENT THE TOWN OF STONY POINT IN A PROCEEDING BEFORE THE EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY COMMISSION

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Stony Point ("Town") is currently represented by Special Counsel, Feerick Nugent MacCartney PLLC to represent the Town in certain legal matters; and

WHEREAS, the Town requires legal representation in a proceeding and action pending before the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission wherein a former employee alleges that the Town discriminated against the former employee; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town requires legal counsel to undertake representation of the Town in this proceeding; and

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The above "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated herein by reference.
- <u>Section 2</u>. Special Counsel Feerick Nugent MacCartney PLLC is authorized to appear and defend the Town and shall be compensated for all services performed for the Town with regard to the aforesaid proceeding at the hourly rate of \$250.00. Such services will be paid separate and apart from those services for which Special Counsel has previously been retained to handle for the Town.
- <u>Section 3</u>. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.
