# Resolution 2019/3- Opposition to State Takeover of Taxation of Utility Property on Taxation of Utility Property on Private Right-of-Ways

#### **RESOLUTION 2019/3**

RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO STATE TAKEOVER OF TAXATION OF UTILITY PROPERTY ON PRIVATE RIGHTS-OF-WAYS

WHEREAS, Utility property located in private rights-of-way is currently assessed by the local municipality where such property is located; and

WHEREAS, the state legislature is considering legislation directing the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance to submit a report analyzing the economic, policy and legal objectives that would be served by the establishment of an assessment ceiling program for all Public Utility mass property within the state; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of such a program would result in New York State taking over the assessment of a utility program located in private rights-of-ways; and

WHEREAS, such program would result in the loss of local assessment of utility property in private rights-of-way, as well as possible loss of tax revenue to local municipalities due to such a program not adequately reflecting the value of such property; and

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The above "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby incorporated by reference as though set forth in full herein.
- Section 2. The Town Board of the Town of Stony Point hereby resolves that the assessment of utility property in private rights-of-way should remain under the control of the local municipality where such property is located opposes New York State taking over of the assessment of the utility property located in private rights-of-way.
- Section 3. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized to forward a copy of said Resolution to the following persons:
  - Governor Andrew Cuomo
  - State Senator James Skoufis
  - Assemblyman Colin Schmitt

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

#### **Approve New Copier Lease for Sewer Department**

A motion was made by Supervisor Monaghan, seconded by Councilman Puccio and **unanimously carried** by a voice vote of all board members present (with Councilman White being absent) to approve the lease for a new copier for the Sewer Department.
